- Rajon Rondo led the C's with 17.5 points per game and 11.5 assists per game
- Kobe Bryant netted 19 points in his only game against the C's this season while Andrew Bynum added averages of 16.5 points and 10.0 rebounds.
- The Celtics are 5-11 against the Lakers since the 2004-05 season
- The Celtics are leading the all-time series 152-120 with the Celtics 77-45 at home

The Lakers tied up the series with a 89-67 victory in Game 6 to force a Game 7...Ray Allen led the C's with a team-high 19 points and connected on first three-pointer since Game 2...he would finish 2-for-5 from beyond the arc...The C's shot just 33.3% for the contest (28-of-84) and 5-of-23 from beyond the arc (21.7%)...Paul Pierce finished with 13 points...The Laker bench outscored the Celtics bench 25-13...Kobe Bryant led the Lakers with a game-high 26 points while Paul Gasol added a double-double with 17 points, 13 boards and added a game-high nine assists.

### BOSTON 92, LOS ANGELES 86 – TD Garden, Boston, MA (6/13/10) – Game 5

Paul Pierce and Kevin Garnett fueled the Celtics during Game 5 and we able to withstand Kobe Bryant's 38 point attack as the C's took a 3-2 series lead with a 92-86 victory...Pierce would finish the night with a team-high 27 points while Kevin Garnett had a great game with 18 points, 10 rebounds, three assists, five steals and two blocks...Rajon Rondo also had a solid night with 18 points (9-for-12 from the floor) to go along with five rebounds and a game-high eight assists...Pau Gasol was the only Laker besides Bryant to record double-figures in points with 12 to go along with 12 boards..The C's held the Lakers to just 39.7 percent from the floor while they were red hot and connected on 56.3% of their field goal attempts...The C's were 62.7% on all two-point attempts.

Glen Davis and Nate Robinson fueled the Celtics attack in the fourth quarter as the two players combined to score 30 points off the bench as the C's won Game 4 and evened the series 2-2 with a 96-89 win over the Lakers...Davis, Robinson and Paul Pierce combined to score 22 of the team's 36 fourth quarter points as the team made all 11 of its free throw attempts...Pierce would finish as the C's leading scorer on the night with 19 points..The C's shot 63.2% (12-for-19) from the field during the pivotal fourth quarter after shooting just 39.1% through the third quarter (25-for-64)...Kobe Bryant led the Lakers scoring efforts with a game-high 33 points while Pau Gasol added 21 points and six rebounds...Lamar Odom was the only other Laker to record double-figures in points with 10.

The Celtics rallied during the second half but it was not enough to overcome an early 17 points deficit as the C's fell to the Lakers 91-84...The C's would get to within a point twice during the fourth quarter but were unable to complete the comeback...Kevin Garnett recorded a team-high 25 points to go along with six rebounds while Glen Davis added 12 points coming off the bench while Paul Pierce added 15...Ray Allen struggled on the night failing to connect on a field goal and would shoot 0-for-13 from the floor...The Lakers were led by Kobe Bryant and his game-high 29 points while Derek Fisher added 16 points...Pau Gasol added a double-double with 13 points and 10 boards...Both teams would struggle to shoot the ball from deep as the two teams combined to shoot just 6-of-33 from beyond the arc.

Game 2 of the NBA Finals saw 22 lead changes and 11 ties before the Celtics came out on top 103-94...Ray Allen set an NBA Finals record with eight three pointers and made seven consecutive threes to start the game (also an NBA Finals record)...Rajon Rondo also recorded a triple-double with 19 points, 12 rebounds and 10 assists...Allen would finish with a game-high 32 points...Rasheed Wallace and Glen Davis both had big games for the C's off the bench...Davis recorded eight points and seven boards (five offensive) while Wallace added seven points and seven rebounds...Pau Gasol and Andrew Bynum both had huge game for the Lakers...Gasol would finish with a team-high 25 points and eight boards to go along with six blocks...Bynum would finish with 21 points, six boards and a game-high seven blocks.

The Celtics advanced to their second NBA Finals in three seasons with a 96-84 defeat of the Orlando Magic in Game 6 of the Eastern Conference Finals at the Garden...Paul Pierce led the Celtics with 31 points, 13 boards and five assists...Ray Allen chipped in with 20 points and two steals...Nate Robinson was huge for the C's in the second quarter after Rajon Rondo crashed hard to the floor...Robinson would score 13 points during the period...The C's would shoot 45.5% from beyond the arc on the game...Pierce was 4-of-5 from beyond the arc...The Magic were led by Dwight Howard and his team-high 28 points and 12 boards while Vince Carter netted 17 points and pulled down seven boards.

## **POSTSEASON TEAM NOTES...**

### **C'S WIN GAME 4 WITHOUT A 20 POINT SCORER...**

The Celtics won Game 4 of the NBA Finals without a player scoring 20 points (Paul Pierce led the way with 19)...According to the Elias Sports Bureau, over the last 25 years only three other teams have won an NBA Finals game without a 20 point scorer: San Antonio against Cleveland in 2007 (Game 3), Detroit against San Antonio in 2005 (Game 4) and New York against Houston in 1994 (Game 2).

### **ALLEN SHOOTS HIS WAY TO FINALS RECORD...**

Ray Allen set an NBA Finals record when he recorded 32 points and connected on eight three pointers...According to the Elias Sports Bureau he tied the previous mark (shared by himself, Kenny Smith and Scottie Pippen) by halftime, making seven of eight attempts before the break.

### **CELTICS BEAT #1 AND #2...**

The Celtics reached the NBA Finals after beating the team with the best record in the NBA during the regular season (Cleveland) and the team with the second-best record (Orlando)...According to the Elias Sports Bureau, the Celtics are only the second team in NBA history to beat outright the #1 and #2 teams in the league before reaching the Finals...The other team to do it was the Houston Rockets in 1995...Houston beat Utah (#2) and San Antonio (#1) before sweeping Orlando in the Finals for the title.

### **PIERCE HAS BIG NIGHT IN DECIDING GAME 6...**

Paul Pierce netted 31 points and recorded 13 rebounds in the deciding Game 6 of the Eastern Conference Finals...It was the 14<sup>th</sup> time in his NBA career that he scored 30-or-more points in a playoff game...The 13 rebounds however was the highest total in any of those games...According to the Elias Sports Bureau, Pierce became the first player since Larry Bird and Kevin McHale to finish a playoff series averaging at least 23 points while shooting 50 percent from the floor and 80 percent from the line...Pierce shot 51.2% from the floor and 83.9% from the line...Bird (26.4 ppg, 51.0 FG%, 86.8 FT%) and McHale (24.9 ppg, 63.1 FG%, 93.6 FT%) both accomplished in during the same series against the Atlanta Hawks in 1988.

### **GETTING OFF TO A GOOD START...**

The Celtics limited the Magic to just 12 points in the first quarter of Game 3 of the Eastern Conference Finals on May 22...According to the Elias Sports Bureau that was the fewest points that the Celtics have allowed in a first quarter of a playoff game since they allowed 10 to the Detroit Pistons on May 30, 1988 at the Pontiac Silverdome.

### **RONDO DELIVERS BY THE DOZEN...**

Rajon Rondo handed out 12 assists in Game 3 of the Eastern Conference Finals and it marked the 14<sup>th</sup> time in his postseason career that he has handed out 12 or more assists in a game...According to the Elias Sports Bureau, this moved him past Larry Bird for the second most such games in franchise history...Bob Cousy holds the record with 20 12 or more assist playoff games.

### **DIFFERENT LEADERS EVERY NIGHT...**

Paul Pierce led the Celtics with 28 points in their Game 2 victory over the Magic in Game 2 of the Eastern Conference Finals...This marked the 13<sup>th</sup> straight game for the C's in which they have had a different player lead the team in scoring...According to the Elias Sports Bureau only two other teams in NBA history have gone 13 consecutive playoff games in one season without having the same player lead the team in scoring in consecutive games...The other two teams were the Seattle SuperSonics in 1978 (15 games) and the Detroit Pistons in 1989 (13 games)...The C's would extend that streak to 14 games when Glen Davis led the Celtics with 17 points during Game 3...The C's extended that streak to 15 games when Paul Pierce led the C's with 32 points during Game 4...Rasheed Wallace extended the streak to 16 games when he netted a team-high 21 points off the bench in Game 5...The Celtics extended the streak to 17 games when Paul Pierce netted 31 points in Game 6 against Orlando.

### **A FIRST FOR THE CELTICS...**

The Celtics opened up the 2010 Eastern Conference Finals against Orlando with two wins which is the first time in franchise history that the team has won the first two playoff games in a series on the road...The ECF is only the 15<sup>th</sup> time in franchise history that the C's have opened a series on the road.

### **RONDO RISES TO THE OCCASION IN GAME 6...**

Rajon Rondo netted 21 points, dished out 12 assists and swiped five steals in the deciding Game 6 against Cleveland on May 13...According to the Elias Sports Bureau it was only the fifth time that an NBA player has posted at least 20 points, 10 assists and five steals in a game in which his team won a playoff series...He joins Johnny Moore (1983 Spurs), Clyde Drexler (1990 Trail Blazers), Michael Jordan (1991 Bulls) and Jason Kidd (2002 Nets) as the sixth player to accomplish that feat.

### **RONDO JOINS ELITE COMPANY WITH TRIPLE DOUBLE...**

Rajon Rondo posted a very rare triple-double during Game 4 against Cleveland with 29 points, 18 rebounds and 13 assists...According to the Elias Sports Bureau only two other players in NBA history have recorded such triple-doubles in playoff history...the first was Oscar Robertson when he recorded 32 points, 19 rebounds and 13 assists on March 26, 1963...the second was Wilt Chamberlain when he recorded 29 points, 36 rebounds and 13 assists on April 11, 1967.

### RONDO EARNS ALL-DEFENSIVE FIRST TEAM HONORS...

Rajon Rondo was named to the NBA's All-Defensive First Team for the 2009-10 season...This was the first time in Rondo's career that he has been named to the All-Defensive First Team and the second time in his career that he has been named to either the First or Second Teams...Rondo was named to the Second Team during the 2008-09 season...Rondo is the first Celtic point guard to make the First Team since Dennis Johnson when he was named to the First Team during the 1986-87 season.

### RONDO MAKES HIS FREEBIES IN FIRST ROUND...

Rajon Rondo connected on 83.3% of his free throws during the First Round series against Miami, the highest percentage on the team of players making more than two free throw attempts...Rondo shot 15-for-18 from the line in the First Round and was the highest percentage of his playoff career for a single-round...The next highest percentage was his first ever playoff series against Atlanta in 2008 when he connected on 80.0% (8-of-10)...Rondo continued his hot-shooting from the free throw line in the first game of the Second Round when he shot postseason career-highs of 12-for-14 from the stripe boosting his percentage to 84.4%.

### PIERCE PASSES WHITE FOR 10<sup>TH</sup> ALL-TIME IN C'S PLAYOFF SCORING...

In Game 1 of the 2010 First Round against Miami on April 17, Paul Pierce passed JoJo White for 10<sup>th</sup> all-time in Celtics playoff scoring when he netted 16 points...Pierce passed Bob Cousy for eighth all-time when he netted 31 points against Orlando in Game 6...Pierce passed Tom Heinsohn for seventh all-time when he netted 24 points in Game 1 of the NBA Finals...Listed below are the top 10 scorers in C's playoff history.

Glenn "Doc" Rivers is entering his sixth season as Head Coach of the Boston Celtics. He was named to the position on April 29, 2004, becoming the 16<sup>th</sup> Head Coach in franchise history.

In his first season as Head Coach of the Boston Celtics Rivers led the club to a 45-37 (.549) record as well as the teams first Atlantic Division title since the 1991-92 season.

Rivers guided the 2007-08 Celtics to their 17<sup>th</sup> NBA championship behind an NBA-best 66-16 regular season record which also was his best coaching record in a single season. During the course of the 2007-08 season he was named NBA Coach of the Month three times. He is the only Celtics coach since the award's inception during the 1982-83 season to win the award three times. He joins K.C. Jones, Jimmy Rodgers and Chris Ford as the only Celtics Head Coach's to have won the award.

Rivers is only the fourth coach in franchise history to have earned the NBA Coach of the Year Award, joining Tom Heinsohn (1972-73), Bill Fitch (who won it with Cleveland (1975-76) and Boston (1979-80)) and Red Auerbach (1964-65) for whom the trophy is named.

In Rivers' second season with Boston he led the Celtics to a record of 33-49. The Celtics finished 3<sup>rd</sup> in the Atlantic division, 16 games behind division winner New Jersey.

The 48-year old Rivers spent four plus seasons as the Head Coach of the Orlando Magic. In his first year at the helm in Orlando he led a team predicted by most to finish near or at the bottom of the league that included four starters who were not drafted. Rivers guided the team to a 41-41 record, and for his efforts, Rivers was named the 1999-2000 NBA Coach-of-the-Year.

Rivers served as an analyst, paired with Al Michaels, for ABC Sports coverage of the NBA during the 2003-04 season, following his release from the Magic on November 17, 2003. Overall he compiled a 171-168 record (.506) in his four-plus seasons as Orlando's Head Coach, advancing the team to the playoffs three times.

Rivers played 13 seasons in the NBA for the Atlanta Hawks (1983-84 to 1990-91), Los Angeles Clippers (1991-92), New York Knicks (1992-93 to 1993-94) and San Antonio Spurs (1994 to 1995-96). He played for three of the game's top coaches in Pat Riley, Larry Brown and Mike Fratello, and holds career averages of 10.9 points, 5.7 assists and 3.0 rebounds per game. His teams advanced to the NBA Playoffs 10 times, where he averaged 11.4 points, 5.9 assists and 3.3 rebounds. Rivers saw action in 864 regular season games and 81 playoff games over the course of his career.

Rivers averaged a double-double in 1986-87 (12.8 ppg., 10.0 apg.) and was selected to play in the 1988 NBA All-Star Game. He averaged a career-best 15.2 points per game in 1990-91. He scored a career-high 37 points against Seattle on February 4, 1988. He also shares an NBA single-game playoff record for most assists in one half (15 vs. Boston, May 16, 1988).

Drafted after his junior season out of Marquette by the Atlanta Hawks in the second round (31st overall) of the 1983 NBA Draft, he played the first eight years of his career with Atlanta, setting the Hawks' single-season assists record with 823 in 1986-87, and ending his stint with the team as the franchise's all-time assist leader with 3,866.

- Recorded his first home win as head coach of the Celtics with a 90-88 win over Portland (11/10/04).
- Recorded back-to-back road wins for first time as Celtics coach defeating Seattle (12/11) and the Clippers (12/13).
- Recorded his 200<sup>th</sup> career coaching win in a 120-113 OT win at Phoenix (2/27/05).
- Clinched first playoff appearance as Celtics coach with a 111-108 win at Milwaukee (04/13/05).
- Led Celtics to first Atlantic Division Title since the 1991-92 season.
- Won his first playoff game as Celtics Head Coach with a 102-82 win over Indiana (04/23/05) in Game 1 of the First Round of the 2005 NBA Playoffs.
- Recorded his 250<sup>th</sup> career coaching win in a 110-108 OT win vs. Charlotte (11/8/06).
